



## **Attention Instructional Leaders – French Second Language Education Adjunct Teaching Professors**

The Teacher Education Office and the Department of Language and Literacy Education at the University of British Columbia invite applications from teacher educators with expertise in French as a Second Language Education (Core, Immersion, Intensive) for a twelve-month, part-time (60 to 80%) seconded teacher position commencing in September 2014 with the possibility of renewal for up to two additional years. One position is available at the elementary level and another at the secondary level. Practica will take place in various lower mainland school districts.

Candidates must have a master's degree, at least 5 years' teaching experience and record of excellence in teaching in a school setting, experience acting as a mentor for teacher candidates and/or colleagues, excellent communication skills in French and English, and a disposition toward inquiry and communicative teaching and learning.

The successful candidate will be expected to provide leadership in the Elementary or Secondary French Specialist cohorts. Responsibilities will include teaching French methodology and inquiry seminars, supervising practicum, assisting with student recruitment, and liaising with school districts.
