Graduate Teaching Assistants must be registered as full time graduate students and have a minimum of a recognized master's degree with relevant teaching experience and academic expertise. Under the supervision of, and in close collaboration with the UBC Ritsumeikan AEP Academic Director, duties include teaching, holding regular office hours, marking assignments, reporting grades, attending course meetings as well as follow-up appointments, where applicable.
