Applicants must have a minimum of a recognized master's degree with relevant teaching experience and academic expertise. Applicants for the teacher education courses (300-400 level) should have experience in the K – 12 school system. They should be familiar with the system's structure and services, with the various stakeholder groups and with authorities involved in the provision of education in British Columbia. Duties include teaching, holding regular office hours, marking assignments, reporting grades, attending subject area meetings as well as follow-up appointments, where applicable. Graduate Teaching Assistant (GTA) appointments will work with a responsible faculty member on the course.
