Duties include teaching, holding regular office hours, marking assignments, reporting grades, working with the academic director on course-related matters, attending program and course related meetings, as well as follow-up appointments, where applicable.

Conditions of employment with the UBC-Rits Programs will require that all instructional and lab staff complete a workshop prior to the commencement of their term of employment, if not previously completed.
